Relationships and partnerships

- Develop school communication plans with clear expectations for staff and families
- Continue to build productive parent and school relationships to support student learning
- Seek regular feedback for school improvement and consult with parents, staff, students, School Board and the P&C through school-developed and Department of Education surveys
- Implement a coordinated approach with the P&C to support and resource school priorities and initiatives
- Continue to build strong partnerships with schools in the Swan Valley Network of Schools
- Further develop partnerships with local businesses, Town of Bassendean and local community organisations and groups



Learning environment



- Build an effective feedback culture with opportunities for students to engage in self-assessment and provide feedback to teachers to further develop student agency
- Focus on student wellbeing by promoting a whole school approach using Positive Behaviour in Schools (PBS)
- Implement a whole school approach to environmental sustainability and responsibility
- Maintain buildings, facilities and grounds to ensure they are contemporary and promote creative and collaborative opportunities
- Develop student centred, inclusive indoor and outdoor learning environments



Leadership

- Continue to build an instructional leadership model to support ongoing teacher professional growth and development including regular observation and feedback cycles
- Embed whole-school processes and programs to help create low variability and consistency of teaching practices



Use of resources

- Align resources to support the requirements of the school community
- Allocate time to formalise and strengthen the existing collaborative planning structures.
- Develop a longer-term ICT asset maintenance and replacement plan to sustain ICT and STEM resources across the whole school



Teaching quality

- Build on a further strengthen a consistent, collaborative approach aligned to the Quality Teaching Strategy
- Progressing the development of a Teaching and Learning Handbook
- Continue to embed classroom observations and feedback to monitor and support teachers



Student achievement and progress

- Strengthen staff data literacy and engage in collaborative analysis of data
- Provide opportunities for staff to participate in moderation processes with network schools
- Monitor the impact and consistency in whole-school programs, instructional models and interventions on learning outcomes for students



Targets

Academic

- Match or exceed the median score of WA Like schools in all NAPLAN assessments in Years 3 & 5, annually
- Match or exceed the percentage of students making moderate to very high progress from On Entry to Year 3 NAPLAN and Year 3 to Year 5 NAPLAN, annually
- Improve the percentage of students achieving both higher and progress and higher achievement from Year 3-5

Non-Academic

- 85% of students attend school regularly (90% or greater attendance)
- Meet the requirements annually of all seven quality areas in the National Quality Standards (NQS) in Early Childhood
